Dear RMFY Friend,

"Mission forward." That was the mantra that we at RMFY reiterated during a unique and challenging year. As we navigated organization transitions, the pandemic, and all of their implications, we approached the year with flexibility, openness, heightened communication and collaboration, fiscal strategy, and a lot of self-care to foster innovations called for in light of the circumstances. While the year was full of challenges, we had real successes for which we are grateful.

We successfully executed a succession plan that enabled us to onboard a new executive director. We engaged a talent search that brought us a new, talented development director. We engaged an organization assessment that serves as a precursor for the next iteration of our strategic plan. We launched a new program extension (SUCCEED) that allowed us to target and tailor interventions specifically for graduating seniors. We strengthened our Board of Directors and staff competencies through intentional professional development initiatives such as the RMJJ racial equity workshops, the Allstate Exec Leadership Program, and the Allstate Leading with Equity program.

We invested in our technology infrastructure to ensure that we could reach our students and volunteers safely, efficiently and with quality. We transitioned our in- person services to a virtual delivery model that enabled us to provide our comprehensive program services to approximately 250 teens and their families

within our community. We doubled-downed on our donor engagement because we wanted to make sure all of our supporters were aware of our organization's moves and impact along the way. We launched our "Community Corners" programs to provide training opportunities and support to the general public. We also managed our finances in a way that allowed us to operate with sufficient cash flow without sacrificing quality programs. Despite how difficult the year has been, we consider it a success!



In the following pages, we hope you will find evidence that RMFY modeled resilience and a heightened commitment to providing excellent student support, youth development, and community care - especially in the face of COVID-19.

We could not have done any of this without you; our network of supporters, our RMFY Family. 


